\$1 a day will provide two weeks of groceries for a family of 5 residing in shelter due to domestic violence in the home.

\$3 a day provides 75 hours of Tutoring for struggling students who just need a little one on one help with reading or math.


\$3 a day will provide 21 sessions of therapy to victims of sexual violence or other traumatic crime.


\$1 per day provides arts and craft supplies for 20 members in the Project Learn program funded by United Way for 1 year.

\$5 a day will allow 200 patients to be tested for routine chemistry panels that includes electrolytes, kidney functions, and liver function tests.

\$5 per month will provide clothing, food, lodging for 3 nights and vouchers for life-saving prescription medications for a family that has lost everything in a fire or other disaster to help them get back on their feet.
